#### Annual General Meeting 2021 receives positive reports

The Annual General meeting of the Trustees of Action Udobo took place (via Zoom) on 16 March in a much more hopeful spirit than was the case a year ago, when the charity seemed in danger of being unable to meet its commitments to Udobo School. #### Give as `You Earn

Most of our donors already use Gift Aid to boost their giving, and Gift Aid reclaim from HMRC provides a significant part of the charity's income. **If you are employed** you may be able to manage your giving by using **Give as You Earn** [GAYE] through which a regular deduction is made from your salary **before tax**, making it tax-effective for you, especially if you pay tax at a higher rate. A £20 donation would cost you only £16, but the charity receives £20. You need to check that your employer operates the scheme, and nominate Action Udobo as your chosen charity, after which the process is handled by your employer. A woman from the Montclair Methodist Church managed to access three grocery vouchers from our local Pick and Pay and three of the most needy families received R1000.00 x 3 vouchers for October, November and December!

We did not plan to have a Graduation Ceremony for our Grade R children, but this is something our families dream of from the time their children begin at the school. So, this year we had three graduations, one per class. Once again, we sanitized the church hall and complied with all regulations, only two people per child were allowed to attend the function. I begged parents not to buy special clothes and once again the children arrived looking like angels in their white dresses and boys in white shirts. I take comfort that they will wear the clothes at Christmas and family events! We had a low- key hour, the children said a poem, we watched a video presentation about the school before the children received their certificate, photograph, school report and a lovely package that we were able to put together for each child. We could not gather to share tea and snacks, but the parents went away happy.



As you can imagine we missed out on months of fees as well as children returning where I had to adjust low fees even lower because of jobs lost or short time payments.



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#### News from Udobo School – the challenges of the Pandemic

After being closed by the South African Government lockdown from March to August 2020 and then again from December, over Christmas and the New Year, the school was eventually allowed to open in February 2021, with Covid-19 restrictions in place. There are 91 children currently enrolled - before Covid the school's intake had reached 120 a year. The children aged between 4 and 7 years attend on alternate days, with a maximum of 12 in a class. The very youngest, 3-year olds, who would be confused by attending every other day, come every day with a maximum of 10 in a class – this restricts the number of older children who can attend. Everyone – children, staff and help, helpers have to wear masks and practise social distancing, no easy task with young children.

Anne Snyders, the Principal, recently expressed her thanks for the support given by Action Udobo:

## "Thank you for all you do for us, I am humbled every month when I am able to pay the staff: during last year's lockdown my staff received their salary every month and I am so grateful for that"

Anne reports just some of the problems faced by the school as it returns from lockdown:

- Wooden cupboards and shelves in classrooms and storerooms have been eaten by termites and woodboring insects and have had to be taken down.
- The back fence of the school site is in a dangerous condition, requiring the children to be kept away for their own safety.
- Ventilation in the classrooms originally stables is inadequate: the rooms are dark and the high windows do not allow the airflow needed to combat Covid-19, so doors have to be left open to troops of monkeys who come in and scare the children! The governors would like to create larger windows to overcome this problem.
- The computers originally donated to the school have come to the end of their life, so the Resource Centre financed by Action Udobo cannot be properly used.
- The school would like to be able to employ specialist staff to support autistic children and those with speech difficulties.

Action Udobo would like to help the school fund capital projects such as these, as and when finance is available. In the meantime, Anne and her team continue to provide a learning environment of love and care to their deprived children as the following newsletter covering the last term of 2020 shows.

#### 4<sup>th</sup> Term Newsletter 2020

Dear Udobo Family and Friends,

At the end of a very different year, we continue to praise God for His hand over us. This year began wonderfully and not only was the school full (always the prayer of my heart) we even opened a sixth class to accommodate a third Grade R class. Such joy and then towards the end of the first term Covid19 hit and the country went into lockdown.

Our Grade R teachers especially did all they could to assist the children in their classes over this time. We put out daily work on the whatsap groups so the parents could instruct the children and then send in photographs of the completed work. Later we put together workbooks for Literacy, Numeracy and Phonics and guided the parents in how to assist their little ones. Altogether we put out nine books – three books three times and the children did a page of each every day.

I was delighted when we could go into school and prepare for the return of our children – the staff came in and together we scrubbed, packed away anything which could not be cleaned every day, prepared a quarantine area and put up posters We supplied the staff with sanitizers and protective masks. We trained for dealing with day to day 'new normal'. We sent the chef and another staff member on a 'Food handling in the time of Covid19' course as well as two other staff members on a course dealing with quarantine regulations in the event of one of the children having a fever or other symptoms. We intended opening in June, but the schools were told to open at the end of August, so we went back into lockdown.

Eventually we opened on the 24<sup>th</sup> August but had to place the children into A and B groups so that we could 'social distance' in the classroom. Every morning we have a team of three at the gate where the children where sanitized, had their temperatures taken, questions asked and finally walked through bleach infused water before they went to class. We were incredibly blessed by the Yellowwood Park Evening Woman's institute who made us 190 child sized masks in attractive child-friendly designs. We gave them out when children forgot to wear their masks and I suspect some hid their masks in order to be given one of our special ones!!

came in for interview. Sharon was our special angel and helped in countless ways – we will miss her as she moves from the area and wish her well in her new home! Wendy Kirstin from the church printed the certificate in colour and they looked beautiful!



We had to take pictures of our children, the graduates in cap and gown and the other little ones in uniform. Then there were reports to prepare and graduation certificates to copy and laminate. We

have been incredibly blessed by a volunteer, Sharon, who came in to help in the office and she quickly became Pat's right hand as she helped by photocopying work for the staff for next year.

I dealt with what seemed like endless families coming to place their children in the school. Schools have closed down, due to the virus and people have lost jobs or have been retrenched and the school is needed now more than ever. People have come in with stories of such loss that I felt emotionally exhausted just listening, but these families have to live the experience every day.. Udobo Pre-Primary is here for such a time as this.

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
